#### Update on COVID-19 From the Town of Needham and Needham Public Health

May 7, 2020 – The Town of Needham and Needham Public Health today provided the following update regarding COVID-19.

#### **State DPH COVID-19 Numbers**

The Massachusetts Department of Public Health is reporting that as of May 7, 2020 there are:

- 1,696 new cases today for a total of 73,721 cases statewide
- 6,729 cases in Norfolk County
- 132 new deaths today for a total of 4,552 deaths statewide
- 251 cases in Needham (as reported by DPH 5/6)
- 33 coronavirus deaths in Needham to date (as reported by the Town Clerk on 4/27. Next update will be 5/11.)
- Four public safety employees have had confirmed cases of COVID-19. Three have recovered.

Please cooperate with the guidance you are given so we can keep you and the town of Needham safe.

#### **Town Clerk Offers Election Reminders**

The last day to register to vote in the annual Town Election is **Friday, May 15, 2020**. Town Hall is closed, so voters needing registration forms to register to vote or change their party affiliation can pick them up at the Needham Police Station or access a form <u>online</u>. Voter registration forms can be dropped in the drop box outside of Town Hall on Garrity's Way near Walgreens until 8 pm. Mailed forms must be postmarked by May 15, 2020.

The Annual Town Election will be held Tuesday, May 26<sup>th</sup>. Polling locations will be open from 7 am to 4 pm. The Town Clerk is urging voters to vote by <u>absentee</u> or <u>early voting by mail</u> if possible (deadline is May 22<sup>nd</sup>). For voters casting ballots in person, expect protocols in place to ensure social distancing. Signage will be posted. Polling locations will have separate entrance and exit points as follows:

Prec. A & B – Center at the Heights

Prec. A Meeting Room - (Entrance front door; exit side door)

Prec. B Dining Room – (Entrance front door; exit rear door)

Prec. C & D – Newman Elementary School

Cafeteria Room 2<sup>nd</sup> Floor – Precinct H (Entrance Rear door up to second floor;
exit rear door)
