("<u>Auburndale</u>") located at 2102 Commonwealth Avenue, Newton, Massachusetts 02466, Post Road Liquors, Inc. located at 44 Post Road, Wayland, Massachusetts 01778 ("<u>Post Road</u>"), Upper Falls Beverage Store, Inc. located at 150 Needham Street, Newton, Massachusetts 02464 ("<u>Upper Falls</u>"), and Needham Wine and Spirits LLC located at 1257 Highland Avenue, Needham, Massachusetts 02492 ("<u>Needham Wine</u>") (collectively, the "<u>Businesses</u>");

WHEREAS, Jack desires those one hundred (100) shares of stock of Auburndale be transferred to Linda pursuant to this Agreement, subject to the terms set forth herein;

WHEREAS, Linda owns one hundred sixty-five (165) shares representing thirty-three (33%) percent of the issued and outstanding shares of common stock, no par value of Post Road Liquors, Inc.;

WHEREAS, Linda desires those one hundred sixty-five (165) shares of stock of Post Road be transferred to Jack pursuant to this Agreement, subject to the terms set forth herein;

WHEREAS, Mike owns eighty-five (85) shares representing seventeen (17%) percent of the issued and outstanding shares of common stock, no par value of Post Road Liquors, Inc.;

WHEREAS, Mike desires those eighty-five (85) shares of stock of Post Road be transferred to Jack pursuant to this Agreement, subject to the terms set forth herein;

WHEREAS, Linda owns one hundred sixty-five (165) shares representing thirty-three (33%) percent of the issued and outstanding shares of common stock, no par value of Upper Falls Beverage Store, Inc.;

WHEREAS, Linda desires those one hundred sixty-five (165) shares of stock of Upper Falls be transferred to Jack pursuant to this Agreement, subject to the terms set forth herein;

WHEREAS, Mike owns eighty-five (85) shares representing seventeen (17%) percent of the issued and outstanding shares of common stock, no par value of Upper Falls Beverage Store, Inc.;

WHEREAS, Mike desires those eighty-five (85) shares of stock of Upper Falls be transferred to Jack pursuant to this Agreement, subject to the terms set forth herein;

WHEREAS, Jack owns a fifty (50%) percent membership interest in Needham Wine & Spirits, LLC which represents which represents one hundred percent (100%) of his total interest in Needham Wine;

WHEREAS, Jack desires to transfer to Linda, his fifty (50%) percent membership interest in Needham Wine, subject to the terms set forth herein; and

- 3. Transfer of Stock of Upper Falls. Linda shall transfer her one hundred sixty five (165) shares representing thirty-three (33%) percent of the issued and outstanding shares of stock of Upper Falls to Jack, and Mike shall transfer his eighty five (85) shares representing seventeen (17%) percent of the issued and outstanding shares of stock of Post Upper Falls to Jack, and Jack shall accept two hundred fifty (250) shares of stock of Upper Falls from Linda and Mike representing fifty (50%) percent of the issued and outstanding shares of stock of Upper Falls (the "Upper Falls Transferred Stock"), subject to the terms set forth herein.

The delivery of the certificate(s) for the Auburndale Transferred Stock, Post Road Transferred Stock, Upper Falls Transferred Stock, as well as the revised Schedule A to the Operating Agreement of Needham Wine, shall take place on or before the fifth (5<sup>th</sup>) business day following receipt of written notification from the City of Newton Board of License Commissioners, the Town of Wayland Select Board, the Town of Needham Select Board (collectively, the "Boards") and the Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission (the "ABCC") of the full and final approval of the transfer of stock, change of officers and directors, transfer of membership interest, and change of LLC managers, as applicable to the Businesses, or at a time or place or in such other manner as the Parties mutually agree upon in writing (the "Closing Date" or "Closing").

### EMPLOYMENT AGREEMENT

### between Town of Needham and Town Manager

THIS AGREEMENT, pursuant to Chapter 41, Section 108N of the Massachusetts General Laws, made and entered into this \_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_\_ 2025, by and between the Town of Needham, Commonwealth of Massachusetts, a municipal corporation, hereinafter called the "Town," acting by and through its Select Board, hereinafter called the "Board", and Kathleen King, hereinafter called the "Town Manager", as follows:

### WITNESSETH:

Whereas, the Town desires to appoint Kathleen King as Town Manager of the Town of Needham to be effective July 5, 2025; and,

Whereas, the Town Manager is the Chief Executive Officer and Chief Financial Officer of the Town; and,

Whereas, the Board, under Chapter 41, Section 108N of the Massachusetts General Laws, may contract with the Town Manager regarding her salary, benefits, and severance pay; and,

Whereas, it is the desire of the Board to have a written contract which will establish the benefits, terms, conditions, and obligations of employment for the Town Manager; and,

Whereas, it is the desire of the Board to retain the services of the Town Manager and to provide inducement for her to remain in such Office; and,

Whereas, Kathleen King agrees to accept the Office of Town Manager of said Town.

**NOW THEREFORE**, in consideration of the mutual covenants contained herein, the parties agree as follows:

### **Section 1. Duties**

- 1.1 The Town hereby agrees to appoint Kathleen King as Town Manager of said Town to perform the functions and duties specified in the Town Charter, and to perform other legally permissible and proper duties and functions as the Board shall from time to time assign.
- 1.2 The Town Manager shall supervise, direct and be responsible for the efficient administration of all functions under her control as authorized by Town Charter.

### Section 2. Term

- 2.1 The Town Manager's term of office shall be from July 5, 2025 through June 30, 2028.
- 2.2 Nothing in this Agreement shall prevent, limit, or otherwise interfere with the right of the Board to terminate the services of the Town Manager in accordance with the Town Charter, subject only to the provisions set forth in Section 4 of this Agreement.
- 2.3 Nothing in this Agreement shall prevent, limit, or otherwise interfere with the right of the Town Manager to resign at any time from her position with the Town, subject only to the provisions set forth in Section 4.5 of this Agreement.
- 2.4 In the event that written notice of their intent whether or not to renew is not given by either party to the other one hundred and eighty (180) days prior to the termination date as herein above provided, this Agreement shall be extended on the same terms and conditions as herein provided, for an additional period of one year. Said Agreement shall continue thereafter for one year periods unless either party hereto gives one hundred eighty (180) days written notice to the other party that the party does not wish to extend this Agreement for an additional one year term.

### Section 3. Suspension

- 3.1 The Town may suspend the Town Manager for just cause, without pay and benefits, at any time during the term of this Agreement by the affirmative vote of a majority of the Board, but only after a hearing, and provided further, that the Town Manager shall have been given written notice at least twenty (20) days prior to such hearing, setting forth in detail the particulars of any just cause alleged to exist against her and the name of the party alleging the charges, if any. Just cause as used in this Agreement shall mean failure to carry out, through malfeasance, misfeasance, or nonfeasance, the responsibilities of the Office of Town Manager, the commission of a crime, or the violation of any Federal or State criminal or ethical law.
- 3.2 The Town may place the Town Manager on Administrative Leave without having first established just cause, but with pay and benefits, at any time during the term of this Agreement by the affirmative vote of a majority of the Board, but only provided that the Board is at that time investigating the Town Manager for some alleged act, conduct or omission and provided further, that this "paid" Administrative Leave cannot be longer than sixty (60) days, absent notice to the Town Manager of the reason for additional leave. The parties may jointly agree to paid administrative leave for some reason other than as specified herein.
- 3.3 Nothing contained in these Sections with respect to suspension or administrative leave shall be construed to violate any provision of the United States Fair Labor Standards Act or invalidate the exempt status of the Office of Town Manager, and if necessary, this language shall be reformed such that no such violation or invalidation will occur or result.

### **Section 4. Termination and Severance Pay**

- 4.1 The Town may terminate the services of the Town Manager before the expiration of the aforesaid term of employment, with or without just cause, by an affirmative vote of a majority of the Board in accordance with Section 20A (c) of the Town Charter, but only after a hearing, and provided further, that the Town Manager shall have been given written notice, adopted by a majority of the Board, at least twenty (20) days prior to such hearing, setting forth in detail the particulars of any just cause alleged to exist against her and the name(s) of the party(ies) alleging the charges, if any. The Board shall, at the conclusion of that hearing or at its next meeting, vote on said termination.
- 4.2 In the event that the Town Manager is terminated by the Board, without just cause, as defined in Section 3.1 before expiration of the aforesaid term of employment and during such time that the Town Manager is willing and able to perform her duties under this Agreement, then in that event, the Town agrees to provide two (2) months termination notice and to pay the Town Manager a lump sum cash severance payment of nine (9) months' salary. If the Board has issued the requisite non-renewal notice as set forth in paragraph 2.4, the Town Manager will be paid the lump sum cash severance payment or her salary through the remainder of the term, whichever is less.
- 4.3 The Board is obligated to make the payment of the severance sum, or payment of the balance of the contract provided the requisite notice has been given, as set forth in Section 4.2, unless the termination has been for just cause (failure to carry out, through malfeasance, misfeasance, or nonfeasance, the responsibilities of the office of Town Manager, the commission of a crime, and/or or the violation of any Federal or State criminal or ethical law or statute). In this circumstance, the Board, in its notice under Section 4.1 must itself call for a hearing and thereafter schedule and conduct same in accordance with Section 4.1. In the event that the Town Manager is terminated for just cause as voted by a majority of the Board, then the Town shall have no obligation to pay the aggregate severance sum designated in section 4.2.
- 4.4 The Town Manager may appeal any termination or suspension via participation of both parties in mediation.
- 4.5 In the event that the Town, at any time during the term of this Agreement, reduces the salary or other financial benefits of the Town Manager (except as provided in section 12), or eliminates the position of Town Manager, or in the event that the Town refuses, following written notice, to comply with any other provisions benefiting the Town Manager herein, or if the Town Manager resigns following a request by the Board that she resign, then, in those events, the Town Manager may notify the Board in writing within two (2) weeks of the occurrence of the event, that she be deemed to have been terminated on the date she gives notice of such reduction, refusal to comply, or resignation, and the severance pay as stated in Section 4.2 shall be applicable.
- 4.6 In the event that the Town Manager voluntarily resigns her position with the Town before expiration of the aforesaid term of her employment, then the Town Manager shall give the Town three (3) months notice in advance unless the parties otherwise agree. A copy of the

resignation shall be filed with the Town Clerk. During this three (3) month notice period, the Town Manager may not take vacation leave unless approved by the Chair of the Select Board. In the event that the Town Manager voluntarily resigns, without having been requested to do so by the Board, she shall not be eligible for severance benefits as set forth in Section 4.2, but will be eligible to be paid for accrued but unused vacation in accordance with the Town's Human Resources Policies.

4.7 This Section shall survive the termination of this Agreement.

### **Section 5. Compensation**

5.1 The Town agrees to pay the Town Manager for services rendered under this Agreement a base salary, subject to applicable withholdings and deductions, as follows:

Effective Date	Increase	Salary
Effective July 5, 2025		\$238,000
Effective July 1, 2026	3.0%	\$245,140
Effective July 1, 2027	3.0%	\$252,490

Salary shall be paid in installments at the same time as other employees of the Town are paid.

- 5.2 The Town Manager is eligible for reimbursement for out-of- pocket expenses for use of her personal vehicle such as parking and tolls.
- 5.3 The Town will provide the same disability, health and life insurance policies as it does to other non-union Town employees.
- 5.4 The Town will make an annual payment of 4% of base pay to the 401A deferred compensation plan offered by the Town and selected by the Town Manager for each year of the contract. The Town Manager shall notify the Town Accountant in writing of the deferred compensation plan in which the payment is to be made.
- 5.5 The Town will make a payment of \$3,000 for each year of the contract, contingent upon the Town Manager achieving and maintaining International City/County Management Association (ICMA) Credentialed Manager status. The Town Manager will share with the Board the goals that she develops as part of attaining and maintaining her credentials.

### Section 6. Hours of Work

6.1 The Town Manager will devote full time and attention to the business of the Town and will not engage in any other business during office hours, except with the approval of the Board and in accordance with the Town Charter. It is recognized that the Town Manager must devote a great deal of time outside the normal office hours to the business of the Town, and to that end the Town Manager will be allowed to take reasonable compensatory time off as she shall deem appropriate during said normal office hours.

- 6.2 The Town Manager shall be a salaried officer of the Town.
- 6.3 The Town Manager may accept such speaking, writing, lecturing or other engagements of a professional nature as shall not interfere with her responsibilities to the Town of Needham.

### **Section 7. Authorized Leave**

- 7.1 The Town's Human Resources Policies regarding vacation shall apply to the Town Manager. The Town Manager's existing vacation leave balance from her prior position as Deputy Town Manager shall be retained.
- 7.2 The Town's Human Resources Policies regarding bereavement leave, civic duty leave, and legal holidays shall apply to the Town Manager.
- 7.3 The Town Manager shall receive three (3) personal days per fiscal year during the term of this Agreement. These may not be accumulated from one year to the next.
- 7.4 The Town Manager shall be allowed one and one-quarter (1<sup>1/4</sup>) day's sick leave for each month of service. Any portion of such leave not used in any year may be accumulated without limit. Personal and Family Health Leave provisions of the Town's Personnel Administration Plan shall be applicable to the Town Manager. The Town Manager's existing sick leave balance from her prior position as Deputy Town Manager shall be retained.

### **Section 8. Expenses**

- 8.1 The Board hereby agrees to request in its budget sufficient funds for expenses of the Town Manager that can be used, at the discretion of the Town Manager, for out-of-state travel, professional development, educational expenses, professional and civic association dues, official meetings and customary office expenses as deemed necessary and desirable for her continued professional participation, growth, and advancement and for the good of the Town, as jointly agreed to by the Board and the Town Manager. Any expenses related to the Massachusetts Municipal Association and the International County/City Managers Association shall be deemed necessary and desirable. Expenses related to other events that exceed \$500 shall be jointly agreed to by the Board and the Town Manager.
- 8.2 The Town Manager shall be reimbursed for any expenses incurred in the performance of her duties or as an official representative of the Town including attendance by her at civic or social events.
- 8.3 Any expenses that the Town Manager submits for such reimbursement must be accompanied by some written document, invoice, memo and/or evidence of payment supporting the reimbursement request.

## **Section 9. Performance Evaluations**

- 9.1 The Board shall review and evaluate the Town Manager at least annually during this Agreement. The evaluation shall be in a format mutually agreeable to the Select Board and the Town Manager. This evaluation shall be based on goals and objectives developed jointly by the Board and Town Manager. Further, the Board may provide the Town Manager with a summary written statement of the findings of the Board and shall provide an adequate opportunity for the Town Manager to discuss her evaluation with the Board.
- 9.2 Annually, the Board, in conjunction with the Town Manager, shall define such goals and performance objectives which they deem necessary for the proper operation of the Town and in the attainment of the Board's policy objectives and shall further establish a relative priority among those various goals and objectives, said goals and objectives to be reduced to writing.

## Section 10. Indemnification

- 10.1 The Town shall defend, save harmless and indemnify the Town Manager against any tort, professional liability, claim or demand, or other legal action, whether groundless or otherwise, arising out of an alleged act or omission occurring in the performance of her duties as Town Manager, even if said claim is brought/filed following her termination from employment, provided that at the time of the alleged act or omission the Town Manager was then acting within the scope of her approved duties. Under these circumstances only, the Town (and/or its insurer) shall pay the amount of any settlement or judgment rendered thereon, and further, the Town (and/or its insurer) may compromise and settle any such claim or suit and pay the amount of any settlement or judgment rendered thereon without recourse to the Town Manager.
- In connection with those claims or suits involving the Town Manager in her professional capacity and covered under Section 10.1 above, the Town, at its sole option, shall either retain and pay for an attorney to represent the Town Manager (including all fees and costs) or reimburse the Town Manager for any reasonable attorneys' fees and costs incurred by the Town Manager in connection with same, providing the Town Manager submits proper invoices and evidence of payment of same.
- 10.3 This Section shall survive the termination of this Agreement.

## **Section 11. General Provisions**

11.1 The text herein shall constitute the entire agreement between the parties with regard to the matters set forth herein. There are no other understandings or agreements, verbal or otherwise, in relation thereto, between the parties except as expressly set forth herein. This Employment Agreement may be amended or modified only by a written instrument executed by the parties hereto or by their successors and assigns.

- 11.2 All provisions of the laws of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts relating to retirement, health, insurance, and other fringe benefits shall apply to the Town Manager as they generally apply to other employees of the Town, in addition to said benefits enumerated herein specifically for the benefit of the Town Manager, except as otherwise provided in this Agreement.
- 11.3 The provisions of the Town's Human Resource Policies shall apply in those instances not otherwise addressed by this Employment Agreement. This Agreement shall prevail over any conflicting personnel provisions of the Town By-laws or personnel policies.
- 11.4 This Agreement shall become effective at 12:00 a.m. on July 5, 2025.
- 11.5 If any provision, or any portion thereof, contained in this Agreement, is held unconstitutional, invalid, or unenforceable, the remainder of this Agreement, or portion thereof, shall be deemed severable, shall not be affected, and shall remain in full force and effect.
- 11.6 This Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the heirs at law and executors of the Town Manager.
- 11.7 For the purposes of the United States Fair Labor Standards Act, the Town Manager shall be considered an exempt employee.
- 11.8. This Employment Agreement is entered into in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts and shall be construed and interpreted in accordance with its laws.
- 11.9 This Employment Agreement is the result of negotiation and compromise by and among the parties and no party shall be prejudiced as having been the drafter of the Employment Agreement.

## 12. No Reduction in Benefits

12.1 The Town shall not at any time during the term of the Agreement reduce the salary, compensation, or other benefits of the Town Manager, except to the degree that such a reduction is across the board for all other general government employees of the Town.

## 6:14 p.m. Town Manager

- Town Manager Report
- Regarding the Emergency Nonessential Outdoor Water Use restriction, Ms. Fitzpatrick explained that, on April 8<sup>th</sup>, the Drought Management Task Force recommended placing the southeast region in a Level 1 drought category. Therefore, she declared the emergency and began notifying the public about the impacts, of which the Board previously voted several exemptions to. The Town's website will continue to provide information and education. The emergency is declared until the Drought Management Task Force removes the area from its Level 1 status.
- Ms. Fitzpatrick stated that on May 3<sup>rd</sup> from 5pm-8pm there will be an all-ages dance party, Spring Fling, at Greene's Field.
- Ms. Fitzpatrick stated that staff has heard feedback from residents and businesses regarding the Envision Needham Center project and is working to organize early morning and evening meetings for businesses in early May. A public hearing is recommended on May 13<sup>th</sup> with the Board in order to further inform the public.

There is broad agreement that the goal of the Committee is to understand the mass of a building and there has been discussion on what this should include. The Committee previously met with the Wellesley Planning Board chair. The Committee's process will likely be long with multiple opportunities for the public to weigh in. There is no proposal yet.

6:28 p.m. Flood Plain Zoning Warrant Articles

- Planning Board
- Lee Newman, Director of Planning and Community Development

Lee Newman, Director of Planning and Community Development, along with members of the Planning Board, explained that there are two proposed Zoning Articles for Special Town Meeting which are required in order for the Town to maintain its compliance under FEMA and to ensure that residents have access to flood insurance. FEMA recently released updated maps, and Needham is one of the communities that has been updated. The Town is required to recognize these updated maps and reflect them in its zoning framework. The first Article recognizes the maps and revises some of the regulations within the Floodplain

District to meet current requirements. DCR, FEMA's representative, has reviewed the draft zoning and assured that it is compliant as presented. The maps will be accepted in July 2025. The second Article is a map change to reflect the new elevations on the Town Zoning maps.

Tom Ryder, Town Engineer, explained that the map changes are very small throughout Town. He concurs with the changes.

Ms. Dowd asked if these items need to be adopted in order for homeowners in Town to purchase flood insurance. Ms. Newman agreed that this is correct.

Mr. Levy asked if homeowners were notified regarding these changes. Ms. Newman stated that notification has been similar to zoning notifications in general, including publishing in the paper. Ms. Fitzpatrick stated that all homes within the floodplain will be personally notified. Mr. Ryder stated that staff is creating letters to be sent to these properties.

6:37 p.m. Police Department Annual Report

- John Schlittler, Chief of Police
- Chris Baker, Deputy Police Chief
- Kelsey Cournoyer, Crime Analyst

Police Chief Schlittler reviewed the Police Department's Annual Report.

Ms. Dowd noted that many of the counterfeiting and forgery concerns are still mailbox phishing. Chief Schlittler stated that the Department recommends mailing checks or other money items only at the Post Office. These types of theft crimes tend to be sporadic from year-to-year. It is recommended that people lock their vehicles.

Ms. Dowd noted that there was no overdose deaths reported in Town. Chief Schlittler stated that this likely is partly due to education, including around Narcan and its use.

Ms. Dowd asked about domestic violence calls and the process after these calls. Chief Schlittler stated that the Community Outreach Team completes follow-ups to discuss resources after these calls.

Mr. Levy noted that arrests to date this year have been higher than normal. Chief Schlittler stated that there seems to be an uptick in hostility and aggressiveness.

The Board congratulated Chief Schlittler and the Department for its MPAC accreditation.

Regarding immigration, Chief Schlittler stated that there has been a decision in Massachusetts that outlines what the Department can do in terms of civil detainers.

The Department cannot enforce federal law. It is important for the Department to keep communication with immigration authorities to make sure that the residents are safe and treated fairly. Those who are undocumented should not fear that the Department will enforce federal law.

## 7:11 p.m. Nuclear Disarmament Resolution Citizens Petition

Joseph McCabe, Lead Petitioner

Joseph McCabe, petitioner, explained that this Article is meant as a follow-up action to an Article adopted by Needham Town Meeting in 2019. That Article called upon federal leaders to prioritize nuclear disarmament in national policy. The proposed article deals with specific requests that can be made and calls upon the United States to adopt the proposals described in the article.

Mr. Levy asked the impact of the proposal. Mr. McCabe stated that he believes people should be able to express their wishes in order to enact change. Ms. Frail suggested that this is also a way to be true to oneself.

## 7:35 p.m. Revolving Fund Warrant Article

- Hank Haff, Director of Building Design and Construction
- Gabby Queenan, Sustainability Manager

Hank Haff, Director of Building Design and Construction, and Gabby Queenan, Sustainability Manager, explained that the proposed Article would establish an Energy Efficiency and Clean Energy Capital Program Revolving Fund. The objective of the revolving fund is to allow the Town to use funds from three types of programs (state, federal, and utility programs) that are being received for completing qualifying guaranteed efficiency and clean energy capital projects, towards future clean energy and energy efficiency capital projects. If adopted, the language would be reviewed by the Attorney General's Office and then an annual spending limit would be established at Town Meeting. This would be effective July 1, 2026, for fiscal year 2027. This will help the Town to fund certain projects that come before it. Funding received from these projects currently goes into the General Fund. If these funds are available in a revolving fund, it will allow better efficiency in order to prepare for future projects.

David Davison, Director of Finance, explained that any revolving fund can be closed at the end of a fiscal year, with monies then being moved back to the General Fund. There is no cap for the fund, but Town Meeting determines how much can be expended in any one fiscal year. The Town receives energy rebates each year and these types of monies could go into the Revolving Fund.

Mr. Levy suggested leaving these monies in the General Fund, as a way to allow for Town Meeting to approve their use, and for additional flexibility. Ms. Cooley stated that there is flexibility in the Warrant Article to specify large credits to be held for certain projects. This would allow for funds to be placed into either the General Fund or the revolving fund based on the project and the monies involved.

## 6:00 p.m. Call to Order:

A Regular Meeting of the Select Board was convened by Chair Heidi Frail. Those present were Vice Chair Cathy Dowd, Kevin Keane, Joshua Levy, Marianne Cooley, and Town Manager Kate Fitzpatrick. Katie King, Deputy Town Manager, and David Davison, Deputy Town Manager/Director of Finance, were also in attendance.

## 6:01 p.m. Public Comment Period

Eileen Baker, owner of Proud Mary, stated that many property and business owners have been working together regarding the proposed Envision Needham Center project. She expressed concerns and opposition to the potential reduction of vehicles traffic lanes, reduction of parking, and addition of bike lanes and medians on both sides of Great Plain Avenue. She asked that the Board take additional feedback from local businesses and residents. She asked for a pause on this project and for representation from the small business community to be included in the planning process.

Envision Needham Center Working Group

Ms. King explained that the original composition of the Envision Needham Center Working Group included one designated seat for each of the following in Needham Center: a small business owner, a restaurant owner, and a property owner. The restaurant owner and property owner seats are vacant. This recommended amendment to the composition replaces each of these seats with a "Needham Center

Business Representative" in order to allow flexibility while ensuring the voices of key stakeholders are represented.

Mr. Levy asked about the role of the Committee, especially with a timeline for a pilot in July. Ms. Fitzpatrick stated that she sees the role as to provide advice to the DPW and its consultants on iterations of the Center design and to make recommendations to the Select Board moving forward. The Committee may also explore funding opportunities. Ms. Frail noted that the original timeline for the project can change.

Ms. Dowd stated that she is in favor of the proposal, as the intention is to find people that represent a variety of views, including those who are skeptical regarding the project.

Motion by Mr. Keane that the Board vote to approve the updated composition for the Envision Needham Center Working Group. Second: Ms. Dowd. Unanimously approved 5-0.

• Debt Financing Outlook

Mr. Davison presented the debt financing outlook report. The report included numerous potential scenarios with a wide array of possibilities and various assumptions across the presented outlook. The capital projects in each scenario included:

- Completion of the Pollard School with an assumed approved debt exclusion vote
- Ongoing public work facilities improvements, with phased completion
- Sewer inflow and infiltration work detailed in the 2025 Annual Town Meeting warrant
- Completion of work to establish a quiet zone
- Projects included in the FY2026-2030 Capital Improvement plan
- The proposed replacement of the Mitchell School, with an assumed approved debt exclusion and Massachusetts School Building Authority (MSBA) partnership

The report provided a summary of the impact of financing all the identified projects under three different interest rate assumptions and three different revenue growth rate assumptions. Mr. Davison highlighted that the report is for planning purposes only and that actual projects and sequencing will differ from this analysis.

In reviewing the five-year capital plan outlook, all the projects that are currently being recommended as Tier 1, or high priority funding, could be recommended to be funded by debt. Staff created nine scenarios which apply debt service to the various projects. At other points in the past that the 10% threshold was exceeded, there have been conversations with various stakeholders, and this always involved an exclusion override.

Mr. Levy asked if there could be impacts to the operating budget based on the projected increase in debt. Mr. Davison stated that this could impact the ability to fund certain operations, depending on the specifics of the fiscal year and the ability in said potential year to cover operating needs from other sources.

Ms. Frail asked what the impact might be on the Town's ability to obtain lower interest rates. Mr. Davison stated that rating agencies like that the Town completes forecasting and proactively looks into the future. The agencies will look to see how the Town follows its policies.

Mr. Levy expressed concern regarding increasing the burden of taking on debt onto taxpayers. Mr. Davison stated that approval of these projects would be contingent on taxpayers voting to accept this higher burden
