 Need to ensure that no risk of public health sanitation issues arise from this proposed change to add the dog run on site. Please confirm.

We do not see a health risk as we do not see a large number of pets in our facilities, the use will be exclusively for our residents. We do not encourage pet ownership and we limit the size to 20lbs or less. On average we may have 2-3 dogs total at any 1 time.

• Will any areas outside be set up as designated dog walking areas? If so, will sufficient dog waste station(s) be added outside to ensure proper disposal of dog waste? Please confirm. How will dog waste be contained and

disposed of near this newly proposed dog run area? Please confirm. We are setting up this dog run area to keep our residents from letting their pets do their business in our manicured grass areas. The dog waste station will be located outside the fenced in run area. Picture of waste station attached

- What protocols have been put into place for the newly proposed dog run area to ensure this location remains in a clean and sanitary condition? In our house rules will require our residents to pick up after their pets. Will onsite maintenance staff be cleaning and maintaining this area and removing waste on a routine basis? Please confirm. Maintenance will be policing that area daily as part of their daily grounds check to pick up papers and debris and of course removing the bags from the waste station. Please include the proposed cleaning frequency and proposed frequency of waste disposal for this new area.
- Will you have a shaded area along this newly proposed dog run, to ensure dogs will have an area on site to remain cool and out of the sun on hot days? Please confirm. The proposed area is almost completely in shade

Consistent with our communications, we would like to informally review with the Planning Board the possibility of a proposed broader use request on June 3, 2025 to include some potential form of residential in an expanded mixed-use development comprising (i) multifamily, a portion of which would be (a) over 55 (b) market rate apartments and/or (c) memory care, assisted living or some other type of health-related facility approximating no greater than 500 dwelling units and (ii) office, R&D, life science, medical office, and/or a combination of the above approximating 200,000 sf of commercial space along with the originally proposed retail, comprising approximately 25,000 sf so as to create a "village" type, mixed-use development with a residential component. It is also possible we might interest a hotel user and may want to consider that use as well, assuming the Planning Board would be supportive.

As you are aware, we have not been able to identify a life science, general office, or other corporate type of user to anchor the approved development, so are considering exploring other opportunities and uses and would like to hear the Planning Board's thoughts and feedback.

In connection therewith, submitted herewith, please find the following:

MEMORANDUM IN SUPPORT OF APPLICATION OF JEFFREY GAYMAN and ANDREA GAYMAN, TRUSTEES 99 Whitman Road, Needham, MA

This Memorandum is submitted in support of the application of Jeffrey Gayman, Trustee of the Jeffrey Gayman Revocable Trust of 2023 and Andrea Gayman, Trustee of the Andrea Gayman Revocable Trust of 2023 (hereinafter, jointly, the Applicant and the "Gaymans") for a Special Permit under Section 6.1.2 of the Town of Needham Zoning By-Law (hereinafter the "By-Law") to allow for one additional enclosed garage space at the property known and numbered 99 Whitman Road (hereinafter the "Premises"), within the accessory cabana / pool house currently under construction, and all other relief necessary and appropriate relative thereto.

EXISTING CONDITIONS / BACKGROUND

The Premises is located in the Single Residence A Zoning District. It is shown and designated as Parcel 15 on Assessor's Map 305 and contains approximately 43,560 square feet of land with approximately 235.46 feet of frontage on Whitman Road. The Premises is currently occupied by a single-family dwelling, pool and cabana / pool house, all under active construction as of the time of this filing. None of these structures require any zoning relief and are will along the way towards completion.

The cabana / pool house was approved for construction with a 6' wide and 8' high double door on the east side, facing the street, at the end of the driveway. However, the Gaymans would prefer to replace such double door with a larger door, either overhead or barn style, 10' wide and 8' 9", to provide better access to the interior space and facilitate storage therein. In particular, the Gaymans would like to be able to use the interior space for storage of a boat. Installation of such larger door will render the interior of the cabana / pool house a garage space pursuant to the Zoning By-Law. Whereas the single-family residential dwelling already includes a three-car garage on the north end, such additional garage space requires a special permit pursuant to Section 6.1.2.

LAW / ARGUMENT

Section 6.1.2 of the By-Law provides, in pertinent part, that:

Upon application the Board of Appeals may issue a Special Permit for one additional garage space per lot, provided that the premises in question are reasonably adaptable to such use and will allow proper layout thereof (including adequate separation of buildings or structures and open areas from adjacent premises), and provided further that the proposed use;

- (a) will not alter the character of the premises in which it is located,
- (b) will not have a material adverse effect on the value of the land and buildings or structures in the neighborhood, or on the amenities thereof, and
- (c) will not produce noise, odors or glare observable at the lot lines in amounts clearly detrimental to the normal use of adjacent property.

In acting upon applications for such Special Permits, the Board of Appeals shall be governed by the provisions of Section 7.2.¹

The Gaymans assert that the proposed additional garage space meets all the applicable criteria of Section 6.1.2. The Premises is to be used for single family residential purposes, in accordance with applicable use requirements, and the cabana / pool house is permitted as of right as an accessory structure and use. The addition of the extra garage space resulting from the substitution of a larger door will not materially change or alter such single-family residential use. As a result, changing the entry door as proposed will not alter the character of the Premises.

The house, the pool and the cabana / pool house all meet applicable dimensional and density requirements and are permitted as of right. The only material issue or change is the substitution of the door to the cabana / pool house on the east side. This will not significantly or materially alter the impact of the Premises on the land, building or structures in the neighborhood, and therefore will not have a material adverse effect on their value.

Finally, because the use of the Premises, including the proposed additional enclosed garage space in the cabana / pool house, will be for customary, single family residential purposes, and because the additional garage space is located inside a permitted accessory structure, no detrimental noise, odors or glare are anticipated or likely.

¹ Section 7.2, Building or Use Permit, sets forth a number of requirements applicable to all building and use permits in the Town of Needham, including, without limitation, submission of a conforming plot plan prior to the issuance of any such permit, the contents of such plan, and that any work authorized by such permit must be commenced within six months following issuance to avoid compliance with subsequent changes to the By-Law.

CONCLUSION

Based on the facts and discussion set forth above, the Gyamans assert that the issuance of a Special Permit under Section 6.1.2 of the Town of Needham Zoning By-Laws, to allow for one additional enclosed garage space at the Premises, will not alter the character of the Premises; will not have any tangible or material adverse impact on the value of any land or structures in the neighborhood; and further will not produce any detrimental impacts to the normal use of adjacent property. Therefore, the Applicant assert that the issuance of such permit is both proper and appropriate and should be granted.

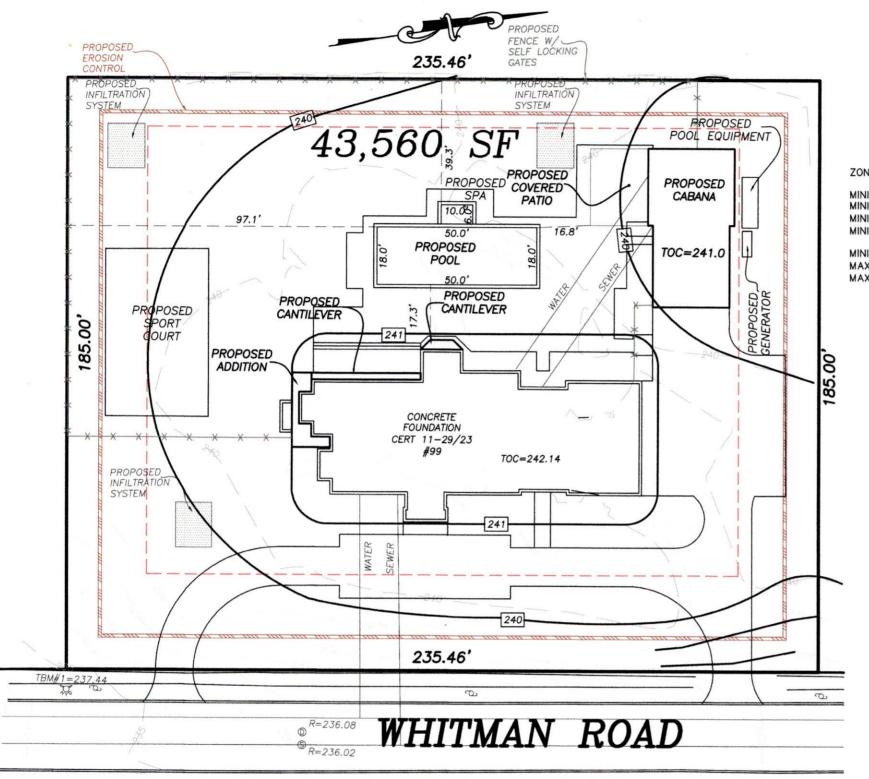

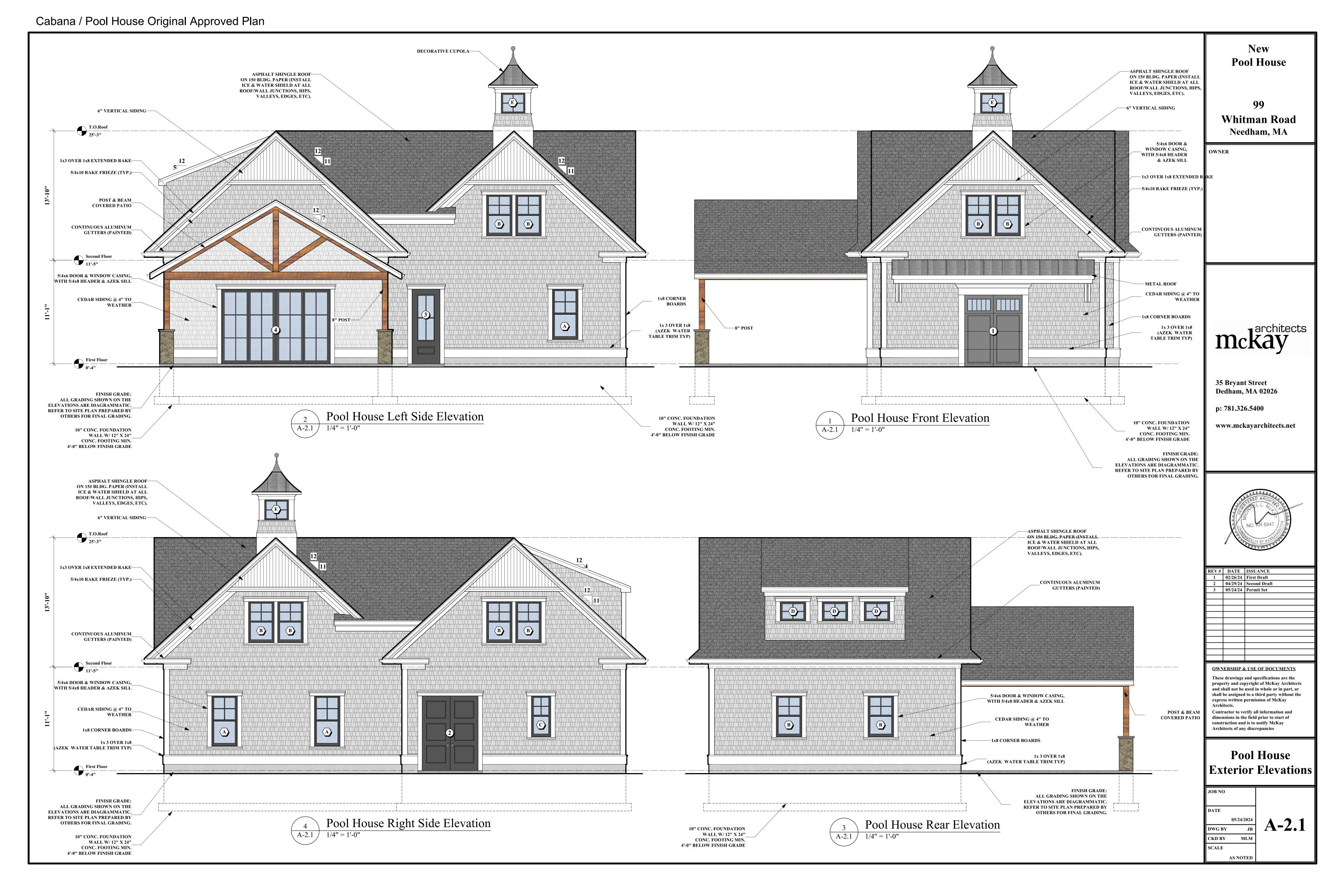

West Newton traffic is a disaster

November 22, 2022 Boston Newton

West Newton traffic has never been good. Its design dates to colonial times, long before the invention of motor vehicles. But in the past few years West Newton traffic has gone from bad to worse, to a disaster that threatens the safety of pedestrians and drivers.



Increased volume is a factor, as are bad driving habits, and technology platforms like Uber and Google Maps that route drivers through the area. But I believe the

traffic reconfiguration that introduced bike lanes in West Newton Square and reset the timing of traffic lights in recent years is also part of the problem.

Case in point: 3 accidents in 36 hours at a nearby intersection, where Watertown street is bisected by Eliot Ave/Eddy Street, about a quarter-mile away from West Newton Square. Someone – a pedestrian – was apparently struck. A stone fence was destroyed. I grew up in the area and have family there still. While accidents have happened in the past, they were never this frequent. Local residents have taken matters into their own hands with "Slow Down" signs and other warnings to pedestrians:



The city has since introduced rubber poles on Watertown Street as "traffic calming" measures to slow drivers. But it doesn't address the root cause.

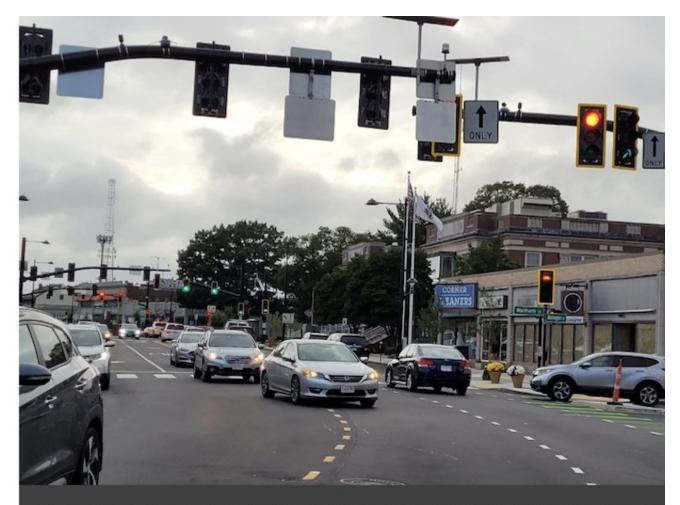
If distracted drivers and poor driving were the root causes, we would be seeing similar clusters of accidents all over the city. So what's happening at this intersection?

In a nutshell, more people are using Eddy/Eliot as a cut through to avoid West Newton Square where Watertown Street meets Washington Street, and connects with Chestnut Street, Elm Street, Cherry Street, and Waltham Street.

There are similar detours all around West Newton Square. Webster Street. Auburndale Ave and River Street. Adella Ave. Hunter Street. Eden Ave. Some of these 'shortcuts' are used more than others, but it derives from the same truth: people do not want to drive through the West Newton traffic mess.

Local residents noticed the situation getting worse during the pandemic after West Newton traffic was reconfigured to include bike lanes, new traffic light timings, and lanes for cars that force drivers to weave a path through Washington Street as they go through West Newton Square. Quoting West Newton Ward Councilor Julia Malakie from a newsletter in October 2021:

'One of the most frequently mentioned concerns I've been hearing as I knock on doors in West Newton is the reconfiguration of traffic in the Square. "I hate it," "I avoid West Newton Square now," and "why are there so few bikes using the bike lanes?" are representative comments.'

This is a very timely discussion, as one of the mostly frequer concerns I've been hearing as I knock on doors in West New reconfiguration of traffic in the Square. "I hate it," "I avoid We now," and "why are there so few bikes using the bike lanes?" comments.

Now that the pandemic has receded and more people are returning to their jobs and social routines, West Newton traffic has gotten even worse, and more people are using the cut-throughs to avoid it. And more people are getting in accidents, and getting hurt, or nearly getting hit.

Malakie and other West Newton (Ward 3) councilors are raising concerns at City Hall. There are meetings and public comments are solicited. I'm not confident the situation will change, though.

As we've seen in the past, successive Newton mayors have been focused on prioritizing the demands of developers and small groups of activists <u>over the input of northside residents</u> and local businesses. They only relent when the outcry is too loud to ignore. Quoting "Newton Pulls Plug On Bike Lane Pilot On Washington Street" <u>in the October 19, 2020 Newton Patch</u>:

Earlier this month, the city removed some 200 parking spaces for a bike lane pilot east bound on Washington Street. Now the spaces are back and the pilot never kicked off, according to the city.

The spaces were removed at the beginning of the month along the Mass Pike side of Washington Street between Sullivan Tire in West Newton and Lowell Avenue in Newtonville as a trial designed to last a few months, according to city officials.

Local businesses panicked, as parking for their employers and customers was removed. According to the article, councilor Alicia Bowman from Ward 6/Newton Center had some role in the plan for bike lanes replacing parking on Washington Street in West Newton and Newtonville, but distanced herself from the plan after people complained ("I don't think they anticipated the level of angst from the business community"). The Chamber of Commerce, usually a fan of Mayor Fuller's pro-development policies, criticized the city:

Greg Reibman president of the Newton-Needham Chamber of Commerce said he thought the city made a mistake by not communicating the decision in advance or giving stakeholders a chance to weigh in.

In compliance with Chapter 40A of the General Laws of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, you are hereby notified that the Zoning Board of Appeals entered a decision with the Clerk's office on May 5, 2025, on the petition of 2-4 Bridge Street LLC, 2 Bridge Street, Dedham, MA 02026. The petitioner was granted a Variance and/or Special Permit to extend the preexisting nonconforming front yard setback of 0 feet (10 feet required) and a Variance for a Floor Area Ratio of 1.44 (0.4 maximum allowed) for proposed four-story Mixed-Use Development with 62-seat restaurant and 26 residential units. The +/- 33,891 square foot subject property is located at 2 Bridge Street, Dedham, MA, Map/Lot 14-50, and is located within the General Business (GB) Zoning District and the Flood Plain Overlay District (FPOD).
