Second: Mr. Cogswell. Unanimously approved 4-0.

- 7:05 p.m. Ms. Fitzpatrick appeared before the Board with four items for the Board's consideration:
  - 1. Town Manager Update:

    Ms. Fitzpatrick requested the Board approve the sending of a letter to Representative Harkins and Senator Brown expressing the Town's

opposition to legislation that would establish minimum staffing levels for fire departments.

Motion by Mr. Cogswell that the Board of Selectmen vote to authorize the Town Manager to draft a letter to the Town's State Representative and Senator expressing opposition to legislation that would establish minimum fire department staffing requirements.

Second: Mr. Bulian. Unanimously approved 5-0.

2. EPA Community Energy Challenge:
 Ms. Fitzpatrick informed the Board that the Town has joined the EPA New England's Community
 Energy Challenge as part of the Town's effort to improve energy performance and become more sustainable. She also mentioned the Town's efforts to promote Xeriscape landscaping at Town facilities and to residents. Mr. Cogswell suggested that information on this topic could be sent to residents through the water/sewer bills. Mr. Healy suggested distributing the

information to Town Meeting members.

The Board opted to move to the high school grounds discussion on the agenda and come back to the Town Manager.

#### 7:10 p.m. High School Grounds:

Members of the School Committee, Permanent Public Building Committee, and Park & Recreation Commission appeared before the Board to discuss the future community use of the upper portion of the High School. Steven Popper, PPBC, stated that the proposal is to hardscape the surface North of the gym so it can be used for tennis, basketball and other hard court games. Marianne Cooley, School Committee, stated that the tennis courts would not be competition courts but could be used for physical education and practice. John Connolley, PPBC, stated that the area will be a sports court. Mr. Bulian stated that the Town needs more usable tennis courts because there are very few in town and most are in poor condition. The Board asked the PPBC for a schematic drawing of what is being proposed and under school construction contract. The Board

expressed a need to maximize the efficiency of the field/recreation space within Town.

Patty Carey requested the Board support the Park & Recreation Department's efforts to get grant funding to help pay for the rehabilitation of the Mills Field tennis courts.

Motion by Mr. Bulian that the Board of Selectmen vote to sign a resolution authorizing the Town Manager to file and accept grants from the Executive Office of Energy and Environmental Affairs and to take other actions to carry out the grants.

Second: Mr. Healy. Unanimously approved 5-0.

Mr. Matthews reiterated that what is being constructed at the High School upper field is what was originally planned. He asked about fencing, potential overflow parking and surfacing. He also expressed his opinion that the chance of the Town getting a grant to fix the Mills Field tennis courts is very slim and an alternative plan should be identified. Mr. Wasserman would like to pursue the effort to renovate the Mills Field tennis courts and explore the potential for a fifth court at the site.

8:00 p.m. Mr. Wasserman called for a five minute recess.

8:05 p.m. Beth Israel Deaconess Hospital Expansion Project:

Jeff Liebman, President & CEO - Beth Israel Deaconess Hospital, appeared before the Board to provide a preliminary overview of the planned expansion of the facility. He stated that the renovations would preserve existing buildings, expand space, bring the facility up to today's hospital facility code and align certain operations. Mr. Liebman stated that the renovations are necessary to continue the hospital's growth. John Pierce, Architect, provided the Board with an overview of the project. He highlighted the changes to the façade and reorganization of operations to maximize use of the space. The Board asked if

the hospital has informed the neighbors of the project. Mr. Liebman stated that the hospital has met with neighbors and will continue to do so going forward. Mr. Cogswell suggested the Board form a committee to act as the point of contact for the hospital during the project. He stated that this worked very well during the Olin College development. Mr. Wasserman agreed and stated that a committee charter and membership would be presented at the Board's next meeting for a vote.

### 8:40 p.m. High Rock Homes:

Mr. Wasserman stated that the Board needed to consider two requests of the Needham Housing Authority related the High Rock Homes Development.

1. Wavier of Project Fees/High Rock Homes: Sheila Pranksy, Chair - Housing Authority, and members of the Housing Authority requested the Board authorize the waiver of all fees associated with the development of the affordable housing units of the project. The market value units would pay fees. Mr. Wasserman and Mr. Bulian supported the request. Mr. Matthews supported the request and suggested that the Board establish a more formal approach to waiving/paying the fees of such a project. Motion by Mr. Bulian that the Board of Selectmen vote to approve a waiver of building, demolition and accessory permit fees under the Board's jurisdiction for affordable rental units at the High Rock Homes Development. This decision in no way sets precedent for any other Chapter 40B project within the Town regarding wavier of fees.

Second: Mr. Healy. Unanimously approved 5-0.

2. Memorialize PILOT Agreement/ Housing Authority:
Ms. Pranksy and member of the Housing Authority
requested the Board consider signing an
agreement related to the payment in lieu of
taxes (PILOT) for the High Rock Homes affordable
housing properties. Peter Smith, Needham Housing
Authority Consultant, stated that the
Massachusetts Housing Finance Agency (MHFA) is

requiring the agreement as part of the lending package for the High Rock Homes Development. Ms. Pranksy stated that the number of affordable rental units is not changing as a result of the project and a PILOT is already in place for these units but needs to be reaffirmed.

Motion by Mr. Bulian that the Board of Selectmen vote to approve and sign the Cooperation Agreement between the Town of Needham and the High Rock Homes LLC, by its Manager, Needham Housing Authority regarding Payments in Lieu of Taxes to be paid on the state-assisted low-rent housing under the Chapter 200 program known as High Rock Homes.

Second: Mr. Cogswell. No vote.

Mr. Matthews asked Town Counsel to speak with MHFA about the PILOT. He feels that MHFA is asking whether the Town recognizes the established LLC as an entity of the Needham Housing Authority and therefore eligible for the PILOT. Mr. Matthews stated that there is no legal agreement between the LLC and the Town. David Tobin, Town Counsel, stated that he would need to look into the matter more.

Motion by Mr. Bulian to withdraw his previous motion regarding the cooperation agreement with High Rock Homes LLC.

Second: Mr. Cogswell. Unanimously approved 5-0.

Mr. Healy requested that the Board defer action on the item until the Board's next meeting. Mr. Wasserman agreed.

#### 9:05 p.m. Committee Reports:

1. Pollard Environmental Action Team:
Mr. Cogswell stated that the Pollard
Environmental Action Team started paper
recycling at the school over three years age
and to-date the school has recycled almost 93
tons of paper.
