7:00 p.m. Public Hearing - NSTAR Petitions:

The Board held a public hearing on petitions from NSTAR to supply electrical service to the four addresses listed below. Richard P. Merson, the Director of Public Works, appeared before the Board to discuss the petitions.

51 Richdale Road - Mr. Wasserman asked for comments on the proposed NSTAR installation at this address. From the floor, Mr. Bill Risio stated that he lives next door and has no objections.

Motion by Mr. Cogswell that the Board of Selectmen vote to approve and sign the petition from NSTAR to install of approximately six feet of three-inch PVC conduit to provide new underground electrical service at 51 Richdale Road.

Second: Mr. Bulian. Unanimously approved 5 - 0.

57 Ware Road - Mr. Wasserman asked for comments on the proposed NSTAR installation at this address. From the floor, Mr. Bob Hall stated that he lives next door and expressed concerns about the excavations to be made in the berm and the sidewalk. Mr. Merson said that NSTAR's permit to install requires the company to patch the berm and sidewalk after excavation. Mr. Hall also expressed concerns about damage to the sidewalk, berms and road surface along the length of Ware Road caused by builders and their vehicles. The Board asked Mr. Merson to look into this situation and to follow up to make sure that NSTAR patches the sidewalk and berm at 57 Ware Road.

Motion by Mr. Cogswell that the Board of Selectmen vote to approve and sign a petition from NSTAR to install three-inch PVC conduit to provide new underground electrical service at 57 Ware Road.

Second: Mr. Matthews. Unanimously approved 5 - 0.

15 Tolman Street - Mr. Wasserman asked for comments on the proposed NSTAR installation at this address. There were none.

Motion by Mr. Cogswell that the Board of Selectmen vote to approve and sign a petition from NSTAR to install three-inch PVC conduit to provide new underground electrical service to 15 Tolman Street.

Second: Mr. Bulian. The motion was unanimously approved 5 - 0.

106 Sunnyside Road - Mr. Wasserman asked for comments on the proposed NSTAR installation at this address. There were none.

Motion by Mr. Cogswell that the Board of Selectmen vote to approve and sign a petition from NSTAR to install three-inch PVC conduit to provide new underground electrical service to 106 Sunnyside Road.

Second: Mr. Bulian. The motion was unanimously approved 5 - 0.

- 7:15 p.m. Economic Development Coordinator Ms. Fitzpatrick introduced Joyce Moss, the new Economic Development Coordinator, to the Board.
- 7:15 p.m. MBTA Housing Proposal -Lee Newman, Planning Director, appeared before the Board with John Edgar, Matt Talcoff and Maurice Handel, who are members of the Council of Economic Advisors. Mr. Talcoff, the chairman of the Council, read a presentation on the MBTA's housing proposal. The MBTA, he reported, has been reviewing the Needham Heights Station lot. is approximately 71,000 square feet and contains 243 spaces. The MBTA is looking to develop this land. Although it could erect a parking structure on the site, the MBTA favors building a 3-story apartment building with 60 units. Parking for the units would be under the building. The MBTA would be required to make new parking spaces in other station lots in town to compensate for the spaces lost to the apartment building. While noting that development would add to Needham's affordable housing stock, the Board expressed concerns about traffic impact in the Heights, especially from cars coming in from other outlying towns, noise from train whistles, the density of the development, and the trend towards developments

in town to be built mainly in the Heights. Mr. Talcoff asked the Board if the Council should continue to explore this topic with the MBTA. The Board thanked the Council for its work and encouraged the members to continue their exploratory talks with the MBTA and with neighbors in the Heights.

FY09-FY13 Pro Forma Budget - Ms. Fitzpatrick and the Assistant Town Managers David Davison and Christopher Coleman discussed finances with the Board. Mr. Davison presented the Pro Forma Budget for Fiscal Years 2009 through 2013. Mr. Healy said that Mr. Davison's report was "the finest example of long-term planning that a town can do." Mr. Cogswell called it "a superb job." The Board thanked Mr. Davison and commended him for his impressive work.

Road Work - Ms. Fitzpatrick reported on the improvements to road surfaces and curbing being carried out on Webster Street, Manning Street, Mellen Street, West Street, Greendale Avenue, Highland Avenue, Linden Street, Maple Street, at the RTS, and the Mitchell and Newman Schools.

8:50 p.m. Board Discussion

Athletic Fields - Mr. Healey reported that the Needham Sports Council, a private non-profit organization, hired Gale Associates to make improvements to DeFazio Field and Memorial Field. He said that the Field Study Committee will hold a meeting for all interested residents. It is tentatively scheduled at the Broadmeadow School on September 6, 2007. At the meeting, the designer from Gale Associates will aive a presentation of the proposed improvements to the fields. Mr. Healey said that it is hoped that construction will begin in December 2007, with a target completion date of July 2008. Mr. Healy said that private fundraising has raised three million dollars privately, with major contributions coming from the Roche family and the Needham Cooperative bank.
