



Once again, I would like to outline the methodology for filling a vacancy on an elected board under Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 41, Section 11, Subsection 81A:

"The remaining members (Needham Planning Board) write to the Select Board, within one month of the vacancy, informing them of the vacancy. Then, the Select Board, with the remaining members of the Needham Planning Board, after one week's public notice, fill the vacancy by roll call vote. If the remaining members do not inform the Select Board within one month, the Select Board fill the vacancy by themselves. In either case, a majority vote of all the officials eligible to vote is required to select a replacement. Whoever is selected must be a registered voter in the town and perform the duties of the office until the next Annual Town Election or until another person is qualified."







6:00 p.m. Executive Session- Exception 3: Potential Litigation & Collective Bargaining

A meeting of the Select Board was convened by Chair John Bulian. Those present were Maurice P. Handel, Matthew D. Borrelli, Marianne B. Cooley, Daniel P. Matthews, Town Manager Kate Fitzpatrick. Recording Secretary Mary Hunt joined the meeting at 6:45 p.m.

Motion by Mr. Handel that the Select Board vote to enter into Executive Session.

Exception 3 - To discuss strategy with respect to collective bargaining or litigation if an open meeting may have a detrimental effect on the bargaining or litigating position of the public body and the chair so declares.

Second: Mr. Borrelli. Unanimously approved 5-0.

6:45 p.m. Informal Meeting with Citizens: No activity.

7:00 p.m. Call to Order:

A meeting of the Select Board was convened by Chair John A. Bulian. Those present were Maurice P. Handel, Matthew D. Borrelli, Marianne B. Cooley, Daniel P. Matthews, Town Manager Kate Fitzpatrick, and Recording Secretary Mary Hunt.

7:00 p.m. Recognize Needham High School Girls Volleyball Champions:

Courtney Chaloff, Coach and members of the Needham High School girl's volleyball team appeared before the Board. Mr. Borrelli read a Certificate of Appreciation recognizing the team on its amazing 21-0 season and winning the Division 1 State Championship for the first time in school history.

The Board congratulated Coach Chaloff and the team.

7:04 p.m. Public Hearing: Eversource Energy Grant of Location –Webster Street
Maureen Carroll, Eversource Energy representative appeared before the Board
requesting permission to install approximately 8 feet of conduit in Webster Street.
Ms. Carroll said this work is necessary to provide new underground electric service
to 1122 Webster Street, Needham.

Ms. Fitzpatrick indicated all paperwork is in order.

Mr. Bulian invited public comment. No comments were heard.

Motion by Mr. Handel that the Select Board approve and sign a petition from Eversource Energy to install approximately 8 feet of conduit in Webster Street. This work is necessary to provide underground electric service to 1122 Webster Street, Needham.

Second: Mr. Borrelli. Unanimously approved 5-0.

7:05 p.m. Hearing: Liquor Compliance Violation

Police Chief, John Schlittler, Lieutenant John McGrath, and representatives of the Residence Inn by Marriott including Najwa Murphy, General Manager, Josh Bowman, Attorney, Sherin and Lodgen, Mark Newman, VP Food and Beverage, Stonebridge Companies appeared before the Board to discuss the modification, suspension, revocation, or cancellation of the liquor license for Needham 365 Bev, LLC d/b/a Residence Inn by Marriott.

Chief Schlittler read a description of the alcohol compliance check at Needham 365 Bev, LLC d/b/a Residence Inn located at 80 B Street, Needham on October 16, 2019. He stated staff served alcoholic beverages to a person under twenty-one years of age in violation of Massachusetts General Law Chapter 138 Section 34. Chief Schlittler said this is the third offense for this location within one year.

Mr. Bulian asked representatives for comment.

Mr. Newman gave the Board a list of measures taken in order to satisfy future compliance checks. He stated all employees involved in any way with alcohol service or supervision have retaken TIPS training, been trained on an electronic Crown Security Products ID scanner. He also told the Board about a new hiring process, signage stating all guests will be carded regardless of age or appearance, a calendar now in place stating guests must be 21 years of age or older, and a third party secret shopper hired on a weekly basis to test procedures.

Ms. Cooley said it is very disconcerting to know this is the 3rd failed compliance check within a year, but appreciates the actions taken to remedy the situation.

Mr. Borrelli said the Board must decide on whether to modify, suspend, revoke, or cancel the liquor license. He said based on the steps taken, he will vote to either modify or suspend the license.

Mr. Matthews said the reason for compliance checks is because the Town does not want problems, sometimes seen in other communities. He concurred with the comments made by the Board.

Mr. Bulian said this is the first time any establishment has failed a compliance check three times within one year. He said a three consecutive day suspension of

the liquor license is an appropriate penalty to be worked out with the Town Manager. He commented that he is happy with the new measures.

Mr. Handel said the time period of a suspension should be considered in a way that does not disrupt guest events at the hotel. He said the purpose of a suspension is to make sure everyone understands the seriousness of alcohol compliance.

Motion by Mr. Handel that the Select Board vote to suspend the liquor license for Needham 365, LLC d/b/a Residence Inn by Marriott for a period of three consecutive days to be determined by the Town Manager.

Second: Mr. Borrelli. Unanimously approved 5-0.

Richard Merson, Director of Public Works appeared before the Board with three items to discuss:

1. Notice of Traffic Regulation - B Street

Motion by Mr. Handel that the Board vote to approve and sign the Notice of Traffic Regulation Permit #SS19-12-17 requiring that B Street northeast

bound and southwest bound be designated as stopped streets at the intersection of Third Avenue.

Second: Mr. Borrelli. Unanimously approved 5-0.

7:27 p.m. Joint Meeting with Park & Recreation Commission:

Patty Carey, Director of Park & Recreation, Angela O'Connor, Assistant Director of Park & Recreation, Cindy Chaston, Park & Recreation Commission, Christopher Gerstel, Park and Recreation Commission, and Michelle Geddes, Park and Recreation Commission appeared before the Board to discuss issues of common interest including: the 2019 Rosemary Pool season, Ridge Hill/Nike site plans, polling locations, recreational opportunities in the downtown, park ranger programs, access to Rosemary Camp Property, and on-going capital projects.

Ms. Carey gave the Board information on the daily use for the first season of the new Rosemary Pool Complex. Ms. Chaston said there were nearly 50,000 visits to the new complex, mostly Needham residents. Mr. Gerstel said non-residents who heard of the project came from Bellingham, MA, New Hampshire, and surrounding communities. It was pointed out that many local food deliveries were made so people did not have to leave the property to purchase food.

Discussion ensued on pool revenue and expenses, with Mr. Borrelli pointing out revenue of roughly \$524,000 was nearly quadruple the previous figure.

Mr. Matthews said the report is helpful. He said two important concerns were whether people would use the pool, and can the Town take care of the facility. He said the outcome is great, noting a commitment must be made to maintain the facility. Mr. Gerstel said many boards and committees, the Parks and Forestry Division, and Department of Public Works who help on a year-round basis made the end goal attainable. Ms. Chaston said community support is very much appreciated.

Mr. Handel said it is encouraging that many senior citizens used the pool.

Mr. Borrelli asked if staffing will continue to be an issue after Labor Day? Mr. Gerstel said staffing will always be a constant challenge, but better planning will help bridge the gap between students returning to school and the Labor Day pool closing.

Discussion ensued regarding the use of the Rosemary Complex as a polling location, Ridge Hill/Nike site and the "Blue Sky" workshop planned for the new year, and other goals including recreational opportunities in the downtown, accessing the Rosemary Camp property, park ranger programs, and the Big Belly trash pilot program.

Mr. Borrelli asked about the park ranger program and having a dedicated volunteer monitoring fields for trash/dogs, an ice-skating rink at Greene's Field, and the possibility of a local skate park. Mr. Gerstel said the commission is exploring possibilities for monitoring fields. Ms. Chaston commented on possible locations for a skate park. She said a short-term ice rink at Greene's Field is possible, but longer term requires a lot of maintenance.

Mr. Matthews commented on the difficulty accessing the Rosemary Campground, saying clearing access points of overgrown debris should be a priority. Ms. Carey said funding to demolish and replace the current building with a covered picnic pavilion, as well as money for a new dock on the lake has been secured.

Ms. Fitzpatrick said the goal for this coming year is to finish what has been started, noting money was appropriated a long time ago for the boat launch. She said every funded project now has a contact person to work toward completion of each project. Ms. Chaston told the Board a basketball court at the Rosemary Complex is not possible due to lack of space. She also commented that the commission would love to see the boat launch completed. Mr. Gerstel commented on opportunities for art in the downtown, citing wrapped utility boxes, as well as sprucing up the railway bridge over Route 135 as a way to beautify the entrance to Town.

The Board thanked the Park & Recreation Commission for the update.

8:05 p.m. Daxing-Needham Pre-Hospital Care Conference Report:

Fire Chief Dennis Condon, Firefighter, Paramedic Mark McCulloch, and EMS Administrator Ed Sullivan appeared before the Board to discuss the Daxing-Needham Pre-Hospital Care Conference Report and their recent trip to Daxing, China.

Chief Condon showed pictures of their trip, noting the Chinese representatives have a lot of respect for the relationship with Needham. He discussed various medical equipment used for simulation of a mass casualty event, as well as the differences in how emergencies are handled in Needham and in Daxing. Chief Condon noted training took place at Boston Ivy Global, LLC., Daxing District, Beijing. He said

working with school children learning CPR was a highlight. Since returning from the trip, Chief Condon said there is heightened curiosity and questions from chiefs of surrounding towns wanting to know about the trip.

The Board thanked Chief Condon, Paramedic McCulloch, and EMS Administrator Ed Sullivan for their report.

8:18 p.m. Town Manager:

Kate Fitzpatrick, Town Manager appeared before the Board with four items to discuss:

1. Capital Improvement Plan

Ms. Fitzpatrick asked the Board to approve the Capital Improvement Plan for FY2021-2025.

Motion by Mr. Handel that the Board approve the FY2021-2025 Capital Improvement Plan for transmittal to the Finance Committee.

Second: Mr. Borrelli. Unanimously approved 5-0.

2. Polling Location Changes

Ms. Fitzpatrick reminded the Board of a working group including the Town Clerk, Police Department, and the School Department who discussed the difficulties of polling locations at the schools. She said new polling locations have been proposed and recommended the Board approve the plan.

Needham Senior/Disabled Tax Assistance Program

Needham's Property Tax Relief for the Elderly and Disabled Fund provides limited property tax assistance to senior and disabled homeowners in Needham. The fund was created in 2003 and is supported entirely by private donations.

This voluntary fund is one of several town tax assistance programs and is overseen by Needham's five-member Taxation Aid Committee.

The average Needham property tax bill is over \$10,000 per year, which can be a difficult burden for limited income homeowners, including many long-term residents whose financial circumstances have changed.


Applications are available in February each year, and are due in early April, in order for the Committee to review applications and apply grants toward the May 1 property tax bill. Elderly (age 60 or over) and disabled individuals with less than \$55,000 in annual income, and married couples with less than \$67,000 in annual income, are eligible to apply. Disabled is defined as a person who has been determined to be incapacitated from working by a recognized source such as Social Security, U.S. military, workers' compensation, or retirement board.

The average awarded grant in recent years has been approximately \$425. Grants can be supplemented by other programs, including the separate Property Tax Assistance program funded by town meeting appropriation, statutory exemptions, deferrals, and Needham's Seniors Corps work program.

Together, these programs help seniors and disabled homeowners remain in their homes, maintaining their security and independence.

The members of the Select Board and the Taxation Aid Committee encourage residents to contribute as they are able to the Senior/Disabled Tax Assistance Program, either by returning a check in the contribution envelope regularly enclosed with tax and water bills, or online at: www.needhamma.gov/taxrelief.
