Policy:

Half-staff display of the United States flag is intended as a visible, public symbol of respect for the heroic service and sacrifice of public officials and military personnel upon their death. The United States flag will be lowered to half-staff on municipal buildings and grounds under the jurisdiction of the Board of Selectmen in accordance with the schedule set forth below.

The Town Manager is authorized to direct that such flags be flown at half-staff upon the death of prominent local officials consistent with the policy set forth above; or in accordance with an order issued by the President of the United States or the Governor of the Commonwealth. The U.S. flag will also be flown at half-staff on Peace Officers Memorial Day, Memorial Day, Patriot Day, and Pearl Harbor Remembrance Day.
